PREFACE

The XXXI. Czech – Polish – Slovak Symposium on Mining and Environmental Geophysics was held in Janov nad Nisou (Jizerské hory) on September 2007. The Czech – Polish – Slovak Symposiums have a very long tradition; first meeting was taken place in 1970 and they are regularly organized alternately in the Czech and Polish republics. The XXXI. Symposium was organized by Institute of Geology of the Academy of Science of the Czech Republic, v.v.i.. The goal of the Symposium is to present and to discuss new research projects, problems and obtained results connected with application of mining geophysics, especially mining seismology to the industry and to promote methods and results obtained by research teams and by engineers. Such procedure delayed the edition of this volume; however editors believe that scientific and technical values of published contributions increase. Altogether 29 contributions were presented at the Symposium; however 15 papers only are presented.
