PREFACE

The 18th Clay Conference in Czech Republic was organized by the Czech National Clay Group (member ECGA and AIPEA) together with Institute of Rock Structure and Mechanics of Academy of Sciences, v.v.i., CR in cooperation with Keramost a.s. and LB Minerals a.s.

Scientific sessions of the Conference were held in Zátoňské Dvory near Český Krumlov (UNESCO landmark) in SPORTHOTEL on September 29 - October 1, 2008.

The contributions were thematically subdivided into following themes:

- A) Phyllosilicates in the Sediment-Forming Processes
- B) Evaluation and Discussion of two Books Edited by Renown Editorial Houses: Meunier A. (2005): Clays Bergaya F., Theng B.K.G., Lagaly G. (editors) (2006): Handbook of Clay Science
